Expertise and expert knowledge are omnipresent terms and powerful concepts in healthcare settings. From highly specialised knowledge of physicians, nurses and other health professionals to the knowledge of non-medical therapists and lay people, to the experience-based knowledge of patients, service users and survivors, expertise comes in many forms and variations. This interdisciplinary research symposium invites participants to critically examine variations of 'expertise' and 'expert knowledge'.
